PILOT PROGRAM WITH LIFEMOVES SHOWS EARLY SIGNS OF SUCCESS

At a press conference Wednesday afternoon, the City of Millbrae, Millbrae City Council, Sheriff-Elect Christina Corpus, and San Mateo County Supervisor Dave Pine announced the success of a new pilot

To date, LifeMoves has successfully placed 126 individuals encountered at the Millbrae BART Station in all temporary housing placements (119 unduplicated individuals) and are successfully assisting dozens more. The organization well exceeded its

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Code Enforcement The First Step in Beautification

The Code Enforcement Division is directly responsible for enforcing the Millbrae Municipal Code.

This primarily includes city ordinances pertaining to Sanitation and health, community preservation, specific zoning regulations, private property vehicle abatement, and specific aspects of the California Building Codes.

Code Enforcement's primary goal is to protect the integrity of public health, safety, and welfare. They control the quality of life issues, nuisances, and violations of the health regulations that concern private, commercial, and industrial properties and all land use enforcement.

Other duties include to provide information to neighbors to address code issues and otherwise help beautify our neighborhood.

That said, there are many everyday property owner responsibilities and restrictions most of us don't know or think about. For example:

DID YOU KNOW?

On single family properties...

- only **40%** of the yard can be paved or covered with pavers
- In most cases front-yard fences cannot exceed **30 inches** (2.5 FT.) tall
- Synthetic grass (artificial turf) is temporarily banned from landscaping use.

The following conditions are considered violations of the municipal code...

- Peeling paint
- Garbage cans visible from your neighbor's property, or the street, on non-collection days
- Blowing leaves or vegetative debris onto the street
- Misdirected or disregarded drainage



DID YOU KNOW THE CITY ADOPTED AN ORDINANCE TO REDUCE SINGLE-USE PLASTICS?

The Disposable Food Service Ware Ordinance № 785 was adopted in February 2021 and had an amendment approved in May 2022. This Ordinance aims to reduce waste in our environment and litter in our rivers and ocean, protect public health, and reduce our dependence on plastic. Some key aspects you can expect as a consumer are:

- Polystyrene (#6 plastics) disposable food ware is prohibited, including take-out containers, utensils, and straws
- Food facilities cannot offer single-use food ware accessories except at drive-throughs and public airports.

- If you need food ware or accessories, you have to request them, or they can be provided at refillable dispensers that dispense accessories one item at a time (not bundled)

City of Millbrae Partners with BAAHA on an Affordable Condominium Ownership Opportunity

The City of Millbrae is partnering with the Bay Area Homeownership Alliance (BAAHA) on an Affordable Condominium ownership opportunity. The 1 bedroom and 1 bath condominium unit is approximately 660 square feet and located at the Park Broadway Complex at 1388 Broadway in Millbrae. This is a City of Millbrae affordable below market rate (BMR) condominium unit that has a forty-five (45) year ownership and resale restrictions. Owner(s) of the BMR condo are legally required to reside in the condo unit as their principal residence and cannot rent it out.

Gross household income must be less than 120 percent of San Mateo County's area median income (available on the [unit webpage](#)), adjusted

for household size, and there are other requirements for the buyer(s) because this unit is a restricted BMR unit.

Adopt-A-Spot Pilot Program

The Adopt-A-Spot Pilot Program is a partnership between the City of Millbrae, the Community Enhancement Advisory Committee, and the Millbrae community. The Program enables individuals, community groups, schools, and other organizations to play an active role in maintaining the beauty and cleanliness of their neighborhoods.

Each spot can be adopted for up to one year, and the application and renewal process will be managed by Community Enhancement Advisory Committee under the oversight of the City. In exchange for adopting a spot, members will be recognized at a City Council meeting and given a sign to place at their spot.

The pilot program will begin in Bayside Manor and Hemlock neighborhoods.

MILLBRAE'S FIRST DISTRICT ELECTIONS NOVEMBER 8, 2022

The City of Millbrae was required to transition to district-based elections in accordance with State law. As a result, five new districts were created. The change requires any candidate to reside in the specific district for which they seek Council office for at least 30 days before filing the nomination paper. (See information to the right)

Only those registered voters within the specific districts where they reside will be able to vote for their councilmember. This new process eliminates the traditional at-large elections.


In November 2022, only Council seats for Districts 2 and 4 will be up for election.



