The City of Millbrae has partnered with SeeClickFix to announce a new platform Millbrae Works that will allow citizens to report quality-of-life issues and request City of Millbrae services.

With the free SeeClickFix mobile app and web tools, Millbrae citizens will now be able to provide City of Millbrae staff with pictures, specific descriptions, and more — valuable information needed to get the job done efficiently. In addition, the SeeClickFix platform provides City of Millbrae officials with a centralized issue management system to manage issues from creation to resolution — engaging Millbrae citizens throughout the process.

City of Millbrae Receives Funding for WaterSmart Small-Scale Water Efficiency Projects from the Bureau of Reclamation

The City of Millbrae received a total of \$100,000 from the Bureau of Reclamation toward a Drought-Tolerant Landscaping Reclamation project. The City will install drought-tolerant landscaping at the city's police department and fire station buildings. This project will include changing approximately 8,000 square feet of turf area into a drought-tolerant landscape and replacing the existing sprinkler head irrigation systems with a drip irrigation system with meters, reducing potable water use for irrigation purposes. The city's 2020 Adopted Urban Water Management Plan includes the city's water use projections incorporating the effect of conservation measures, including landscape water budgets, which align with the project objectives.

The City of Millbrae supplies potable water to its residents and businesses which can get challenging amid regular periods of severe drought in the State of California -like the current one--, exacerbated with climate change. The City has been able to convert part of City Hall's landscape to a drought-tolerant in year 2015, but funding was not enough to cover the adjacent Police and Fire stations landscaped areas. Converting these two city-owned landscapes is an opportunity not only to reduce water usage and improve water efficiency, but also to lead by example and educate residents on drought tolerant gardening and landscaping strategies. Converting these landscapes would also become more coherent with City's Environmental Programs, especially since the City has been offering a [lawn conversion rebate \(Lawn Be Gone!\)](#) to residents through BAWSCA (Bay Area Water Supply & Conservation Agency).

ELECTRIC PORTABLE SPACE HEATER SAFETY

When the weather turns cold, it can bring a chill into our homes. Portable space heaters have become a popular way to supplement central heating or heat one room. If you plan to use portable electric space heaters, make sure to follow these tips and recommendations:

1

NEVER LEAVE THE HEATER OPERATING WHILE UNATTENDED, OR WHILE YOU ARE SLEEPING.

2

KEEP COMBUSTIBLE MATERIAL SUCH AS BEDS, SOFAS, CURTAINS, PAPERS, AND CLOTHES AT LEAST 3 FEET FROM THE FRONT, SIDES, AND REAR OF THE HEATER.

CHOOSE A HEATER WITH A THERMOSTAT AND OVERHEAT PROTECTION.

4

PLACE THE HEATER ON A SOLID, FLAT SURFACE.

5

MAKE SURE YOUR HEATER HAS AN AUTO SHUT-OFF TO TURN THE HEATER OFF IF IT TIPS OVER.

6

KEEP SPACE HEATERS OUT OF THE WAY OF FOOT TRAFFIC. NEVER BLOCK AN EXIT.

7

KEEP CHILDREN AWAY FROM THE SPACE HEATER.

8

PLUG THE HEATER DIRECTLY INTO THE WALL OUTLET. NEVER USE AN EXTENSION CORD.

9

SPACE HEATERS SHOULD BE TURNED OFF AND UNPLUGGED WHEN YOU LEAVE THE ROOM OR GO TO BED.
