

New Ordinance Prohibiting Synthetic Grass and Artificial Turf Landscaping

In light of concerns about the effects of unregulated synthetic grass and artificial turf landscaping, the City Council established a temporary moratorium on October 26, 2021, placing a pause on all synthetic turf installations until a new ordinance could be drafted. On Tuesday, October 24, 2023, the Millbrae City Council approved an ordinance prohibiting the installation of synthetic grass and artificial turf consistent with new state laws.

The City seeks to prohibit synthetic grass and artificial turf because the unregulated use of the material has been found to have an adverse effect on public health and safety, stormwater management and pollutant discharge, groundwater recharge, soil biodiversity, and neighborhood character. Synthetic grass and artificial turf function as a barrier that limits the absorption of groundwater, resulting in pooling and greater runoff during storm events. As much of the City of Millbrae is located on a hillside, this reduction in absorption presents a significant risk to the City's storm drain capacity and the overall capacity of the City's stormwater system. Plastics and microfibers are also released, contaminating the Bay, local streams, and aquatic life.

Since new installations of artificial turf grass are no longer legal and/or allowed, there is a provision for residents with existing synthetic grass and artificial turf landscaping that allows it to remain until it shows visible signs of wear and tear. Visible signs of wear and tear include identifiable holes, tears, stains, discoloration, seam separations, lifted surfaces, loose or separated nap and netting, buckling, and flaking. It is at this point that the ordinance requires the removal of artificial turf and the installation of natural landscaping plant material. This requirement ensures onsite percolation and groundwater recharge and lessens the impact on our storm drain systems.

Let's play some Tennis and Pickle Ball!

We are excited to announce the completion of the tennis courts and now added pickleball resurfacing project!

The tennis courts at Central Park have served the community for several years and had reached the end of their service life. The courts were initially slated for resurfacing in 2015; however, the city put the project on hold following the community center's fire incident. After the completion of the Recreation Center, the



City awarded a construction contract to American Asphalt Repair and Resurfacing Co., Inc. (Contractor) for the 2022 Central Park Tennis Courts Rehabilitation Project. The project consisted of repairing the full-depth base of the uplifted area, resurfacing the courts with an asphalt concrete overlay and acrylic coating system, patching all cracks, replacing all nets, adjusting and repairing the chain link fence, and installing new court line markings. In addition to rehabilitating the courts, four pickleball courts were added to the two tennis courts.

The courts are currently open and available for public use. We hope the community enjoys these new courts and makes lots of memories playing tennis and pickleball!

On Saturday, November 4th, Goodwill and the County came together with the City of Millbrae for a one-day Free electronics and clothing reuse and recycling drop-off event.
