EARTH & ARBOR DAY CELEBRATION



Thank you to our community for participating in our annual Earth and Arbor Day Event held this past Saturday from 9:00 AM to 12:00 PM on the Spur trail by the Skate Park. Over 100 attendees, the majority of whom were high school students, spent time in the sun keeping Millbrae clean and green.

The Parks Division staff dug holes in advance for easy planting at the event. Starting at 6:00 AM, they hauled 15 coast live oaks to Spur Trail and worked with the Earth and Arbor Day Volunteers to plant and secure each tree.

After all the trees were planted with supports in place, volunteers began the clean-up. They cleaned Magnolia Avenue, Broadway Avenue, and the Spur Trail from the Skatepark to Rotary Park. The Volunteers filled half a two-cubic-yard dumpster with their findings.

It was impressive to see so many teenagers gathering at 9:00 AM on a Saturday morning to plant trees and pick up trash. We are so proud of our youth in Millbrae who step up to help their community thrive!

Thank you to Millbrae Leo's Club, the Mills Science teacher, Mr. DeBois, The Millbrae Cub Scouts, City of Millbrae Staff, and our community for making this event successful.

INFORMATION ON THE FIRE ASSESSMENT

Beginning on April 26, 2024, each property owner in Millbrae will receive a ballot regarding the fire assessment in the mail. Ballots are due no later than June 11, 2024.

A public hearing for this assessment will be held on June 11 at the regularly scheduled City Council Meeting.

The City will host two more informational meetings: Wednesday, May 15, 2024, from 6:00 PM to 7:00 PM at the Millbrae Library in Rooms A&B and Saturday, June 1, 2024, from 10:00 AM to 11:00 AM in the David J. Chetcuti Community Room.

NEW SOLAR SYSTEM LAUNCHED AT MILLBRAE RECREATION CENTER

As of April 12, 2024, the City of Millbrae has successfully installed a state-of-the-art solar array at the Millbrae Recreation Center, made possible through Peninsula Clean Energy's innovative Solar for Public Buildings program. Our photovoltaic (PV) system creates enough energy to power fifteen houses daily, significantly reducing the City of Millbrae's carbon footprint and reliance on fossil fuels. This marks a significant step forward in the City of Millbrae's commitment to renewable energy and sustainability and supports our goals within our Climate Action Plan.
