Tree Protection and Preservation Ordinance

Trees and the urban forest provide a variety of important benefits to our urban environment, including improving our air quality, protecting water quality, providing habitat for wildlife, and supporting our health and well-being. To help preserve and promote Millbrae's urban tree canopy, the City Council recently approved an update to its Tree Ordinance for the first time since 1993.

Until now, the City's Tree Ordinance only applied to street trees. Beginning in September, the new ordinance (in Millbrae Municipal Code Chapter 8.60) will also apply to trees on private properties. Residents or their tree contractor will be required to register with the City for a simple "no-fee" permit before performing work on any street tree or protected tree located on private property that necessitates the removal of more than 25% of the tree's mass. A tree permit will also be required for the removal or relocation of trees.

The State of California (Cal Bus. & Prof. §7026.1) requires all major tree work to be conducted by a licensed tree and palm contractor. Under the law, gardeners are limited to performing only incidental trimming of trees measuring less than 15 feet in height after planting.



While the vast majority of times, no accidents occur during a tree service, they can occur. A licensed tree contractor is required to have the proper insurance and certifications to protect homeowners and their neighbors and ensure that tree work is being done safely and properly.

City of Millbrae Citywide Objective Residential Design Standards and Zoning Code Amendments.

The Objective Design Standards survey concluded and received seventy-seven (77) responses. Thank you to everyone who participated. Your feedback is key to shaping the vision for the future of Millbrae's neighborhoods. If you did not get a chance to participate in the survey but would still like to share your input, there are more opportunities coming.

The City is hosting a community workshop as it begins to prepare its objective design standards for residential development for all of Millbrae's neighborhoods and districts. The project will result in new, detailed, and illustrated design requirements for new construction, additions, and exterior modifications for a variety of residential housing types in the city and will ensure that future residential development is high quality, fits in with the neighborhood, and reflects Millbrae's unique character. The community workshop will be held simultaneously in-person and virtually on Zoom on Thursday, September 5, 2024, at 7:00 p.m.

Respect the Rec!

We are excited to welcome back the students to the Millbrae Recreation Center for the new school year and support them through their next year of learning! We are asking for your help to maintain the beauty of the Recreation Center!

To help us, we ask that everyone utilize the designated pathways and avoid walking through the plants. You are welcome to utilize our community rooms and outside sitting areas, but please be sure to take all trash and gum with you or dispose of it in one of our many garbage and recycling bins.

Students coming after school hours should respect the space in the Recreation Center. This includes being aware of others (including older adults) who utilize the space and following our patron protocols. Unaccompanied minors are not allowed in the upstairs space, which is reserved for adults and minors who are registered participants in classes.

Taylor Middle School Drop-Off & Pick-Up Areas

For drop-off/pick-up in front of Taylor Middle School, the entrance is the driveway located to the west of the main school building on Taylor Boulevard.

For drop-off/pick-up in the rear of Taylor Middle School, the entrance is the driveway to the Millbrae School District office located on Richmond Drive.

The City of Millbrae has been collaborating with the Millbrae School District to ensure that your student(s) can be safely dropped off and picked up.

This year the Millbrae School District is implementing two new student drop-off/pick-up areas to help better facilitate traffic flow around the school and increase safety. These areas are located off of Taylor Boulevard and Richmond Drive. Signs to direct you to these drop-off/pick-up areas have been installed to help guide you. **Drop-offs will no longer be permitted in the Millbrae Recreation Center Parking Lot.**

For drop-off/pick-up in front of Taylor Middle School, the entrance is the driveway located to the west of the main school building on Taylor Boulevard.

For drop-off/pick-up in the rear of Taylor Middle School, the entrance is the driveway to the Millbrae School District office located on Richmond Drive. Please see the maps below.

Please refrain from making U-turns in front of Taylor Middle School and from dropping off your student(s) in the Millbrae Recreation Center Parking Lot. Although the Millbrae Recreation Center's proximity to the school might seem convenient for some parents, the increased number of vehicles during peak hours creates a chaotic and unsafe environment for both students and Recreation Center patrons.

The City recommends students be dropped off at the designated drop-off zones located off of Taylor Boulevard, west of the Taylor Middle School building, or off of Richmond Drive in front of the Millbrae School District Office. These areas are specifically designed to handle the volume of traffic associated with school activities and are equipped with the necessary safety measures to protect the students.

Three route options are currently under consideration to fill this Bay Trail gap. This route must meet the Bay Trail Program goals:

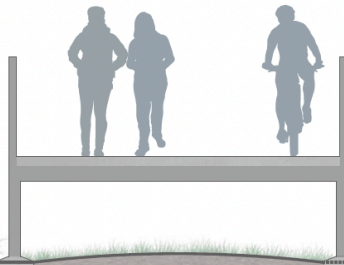
- Foster active transportation

Un estudio está en marcha para cerrar una brecha de 3 millas del Bay Trail a través de Millbrae y San Bruno.

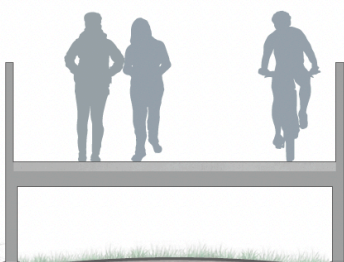
