Developers Break Ground on Old Office Depot Property

The developers of the property formerly occupied by Office Depot, 959 El Camino Real, are beginning to break ground on the demolition of the building. The 1.86-acre former Office Depot property was entitled in July 2022 with plans to redevelop the property into a six-story mixed-use building consisting of 278 residential units, including 26 affordable units, 17,210 square feet of ground floor retail and commercial space, and two levels of interior parking.

In addition, the property will include a public plaza on the southwest corner of the property on Broadway. The public plaza features a trellis with a connected seat wall, multiple landscaped areas, several trees along Broadway and within the plaza, decorative pavers, ample area for commercial tenants to provide outdoor furnishing, in-ground lighting, as well as a bollard lighting to illuminate the pathways. The landscaping of the plaza includes a combination of grass, succulent planting, and shrubs along with Sawleaf Zelkovas to continue the row of street trees on Broadway. The new public plaza will be an excellent addition to our downtown area and will bring people together.

City of Millbrae Citywide Objective Residential Design Standards and Zoning Code Amendments.



The Citywide Objective Residential Design Standards and Zoning Code Amendments project is a two-year effort, begun in January 2024, to develop new design standards for residential development throughout the City. Once they are adopted by the City Council, these new illustrated standards will apply to all residential and residential mixed-use projects. The standards will ensure that future residential

development is of high quality, fits in with the neighborhood, and reflects Millbrae's unique character.

The City hosted a community workshop on the emerging objective residential design standards where the City explained the objectives of the effort and received input on design preferences. The workshop featured interactive questions using Mentimeter, an online platform that enables users to submit responses using their smartphones with results displayed in real-time for all participants to see. The workshop attracted 22 participants. Next steps: City staff will hold a Planning Commission study session in the next couple of months. 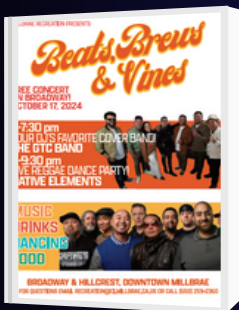
