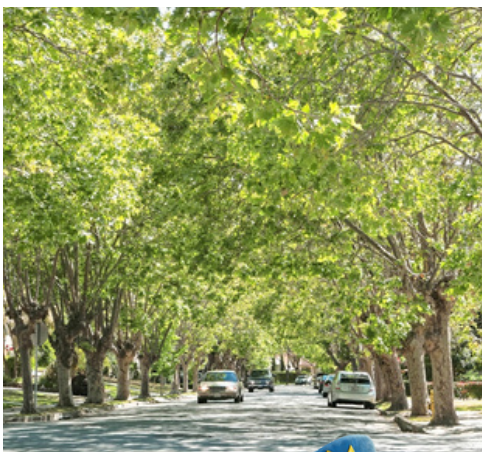

CCFD Sends Strike Team to Napa

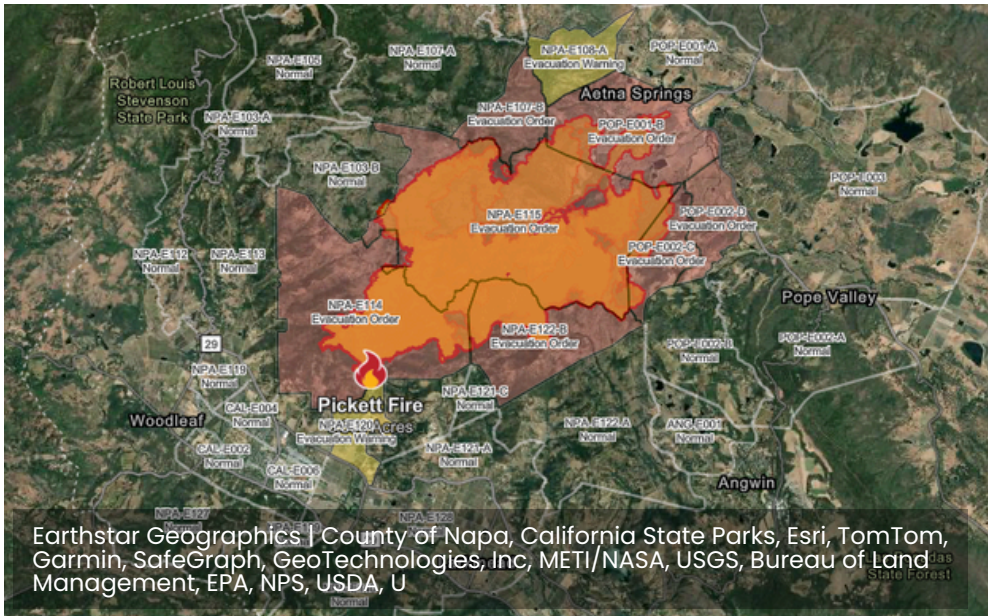
Central County Fire has deployed Engine 132 as part of a strike team responding to the Pickett Fire burning in Napa County. The Pickett Fire sparked on Thursday, August 21st near Pickett Road in Calistoga and continues to burn at 6,803 acres with 33% containment,

according to the latest CAL FIRE update from August 28. Currently, 212 structures remain threatened by the fire.

The deployment of Central County Fire Engine 132 exemplifies California's mutual aid system, where fire departments coordinate resources during major incidents. The fire has mobilized significant resources including 220 engines, 36 water tenders, 9 helicopters, 52 dozers, 59 hand crews, and 2,608 total personnel from multiple agencies. Central County

Fire's Engine 132 is among the 220 engines deployed to combat the blaze, representing the department's commitment to mutual aid efforts that protect communities throughout the region. The cause of the fire remains under investigation.

Photos from the deployment show Engine 132 crews working in the challenging terrain alongside firefighters from agencies across California, demonstrating the collaborative response needed to tackle major wildfire incidents in our state.
