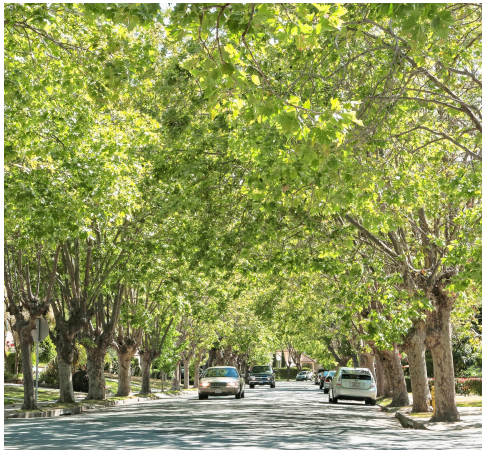

Millbrae Prepares for First Major Storm of the Season

BEFORE

Millbrae is getting ready for what could be the Bay Area's heaviest rainfall since last winter. A typhoon near Japan is sending atmospheric energy our way that's combining with local weather patterns to create a substantial storm system.

Rain is expected to begin late Monday night and continue through most of Tuesday, with total amounts ranging from half an inch to 2 inches between Monday and Wednesday.

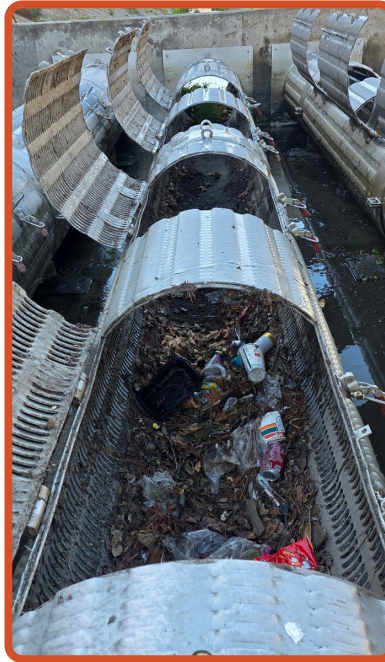
While the typhoon won't reach us directly, its effects are strong enough to bring us serious rainfall, possibly the heaviest we've seen since last winter.

Wind gusts up to 30 mph will scatter leaves and debris around the area, which could clog storm drains at the worst possible time.

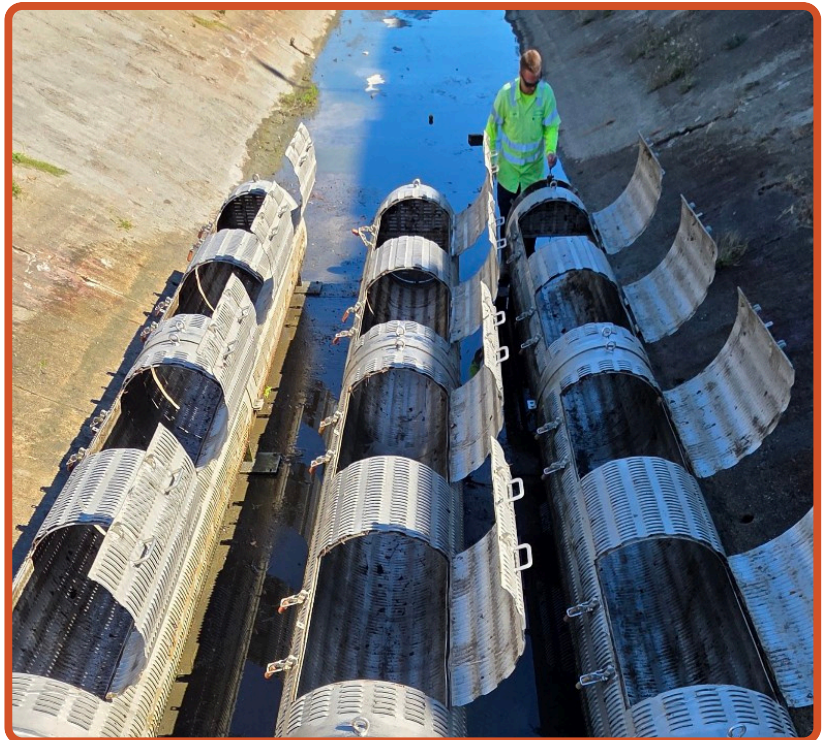
Fortunately, our public works crew has been out preparing by cleaning all city storm drains, seasonal creeks, trash capture devices, gross solid devices, pump station wet wells, and SFO outlets to make sure water can flow properly to the bay thereby preventing flooding and backups.

Residents can help by keeping an eye on storm drains near their homes. If you notice one getting clogged with leaves, either clear it yourself if you can do so safely, or report it through SeeClickFix. Taking this simple step can prevent a minor issue from becoming a major flooding problem.

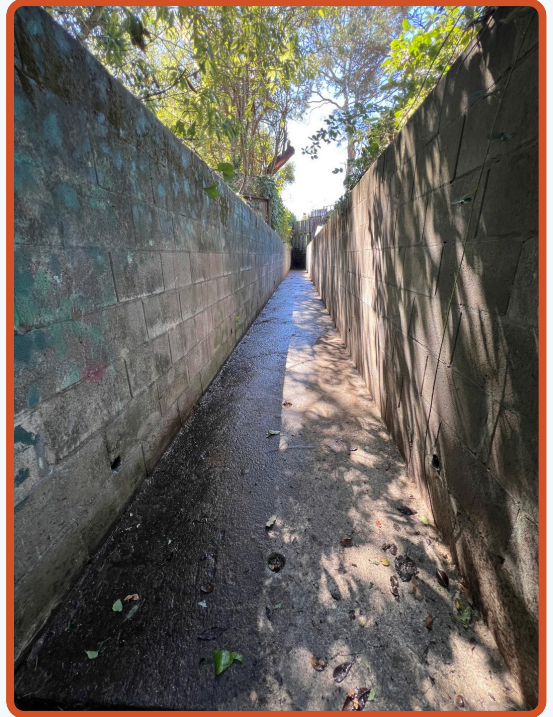
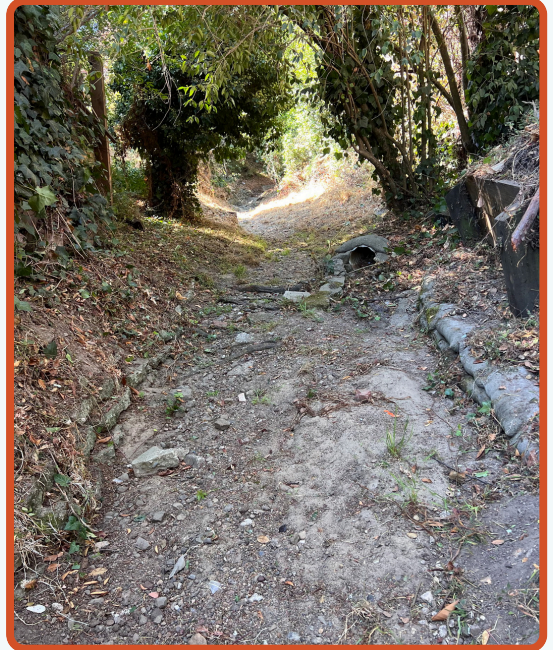
Since dry weather is expected through Sunday, now is the time to prepare your property. Clear your gutters, secure any outdoor furniture that might blow around, and take care of other preparations before the rain arrives. A little work now will make dealing with the storm much easier.

Theft of Recyclables

Is someone taking your recyclables? Under and Millbrae Municipal Code Section 6.15.150 and California Public Resources Code Section 41950-, the theft of recyclables is prohibited. Once residential waste bins/carts are set out for collection, the materials inside are entrusted to South San Francisco Scavenger Company. It is illegal for an uninvited third party to remove items.

How does theft of recyclables affect our community?

Theft of recyclables may:

- Increase litter and noise
- Discourage residents and businesses from recycling
- Impact our community's ability to accurately track landfill diversion

Donate your electronics and clothing at an upcoming Electronics Recycling and Reuse Drop-Off event in Millbrae! Accepted and non-accepted items are listed below. This event is free and open to all San Mateo County Residents.

Items accepted: small appliances (microwaves, hairdryers, vacuum cleaners, lamps (without bulbs), radios, phones, laptops, etc), other electronics (fax machines, copiers, printers, scanners, TVs, DVD players, electronic video games), clothing, shoes blankets, decorative pillows, and towels.

Items NOT accepted: batteries of any kind, fluorescent lights, hazardous household waste, smoke detectors, solar panels, thermostats, large appliances (stoves, dryers, washing machines, air conditioners), furniture, bed sheets, bed pillows, or dirty clothes
Residents must provide proof of residency in San Mateo County (e.g., driver's license, utility bill, garbage collection bill, etc.).

We accept both working and nonworking electronics; working electronic items will be donated to local Goodwill stores for reuse.

Millbrae Launches Environmental Programs for 2025-2026

The City of Millbrae has announced their environmental programs for the fiscal year offering financial incentives and free resources to help residents conserve water and embrace sustainable practices.

As the rainy season approaches, the Rain Barrel Rebate program provides up to \$200 for purchasing and installing rain barrels to collect and reuse rainwater for lawns and gardens. To cut down on irrigation costs, the Lawn Be Gone program returns with \$2.00 per square foot rebates for replacing turf with drought-tolerant landscaping, plus an additional \$300 for adding a rain garden. The Irrigation Hardware Rebate program offers rebates up to \$30 for high-efficiency irrigation devices to help yards become more drought-ready.

Residents concerned about water consumption or potential leaks can use the Self Water Audit Tool, which guides users through checking their water usage. The Public Works counter at City Hall also distributes free water-saving devices including moisture meters, toilet leak tablets, aerators, and high-efficiency hose nozzles.

To make cooking better for your health, Millbrae offers residents the chance to borrow a portable induction cooktop for one week at no cost. These burners provide quicker, more even heating without open flames or harmful gas emissions.

Finally, the nonprofit SunShares program helps residents add solar panels and battery storage at discounted rates through pre-vetted installers. Interested homeowners should act quickly, as the limited-time discount expires November 15th, 2025.

These programs demonstrate Millbrae's commitment to supporting residents in making sustainable choices that benefit both their households and the environment. For more information and links to each program, visit the city's website.
