The Murchison Drive Bicycle Project

The Murchison Drive Bicycle Project is a joint project between the Cities of Millbrae and Burlingame, as the centerline of Murchison Drive serves as the boundary between the two communities. The project's goal is to improve safety and connectivity for cyclists between the two cities by adding new bike facilities along Murchison, Trousdale, and Davis. These improvements support the broader "Complete Streets" and Active Transportation initiatives in both communities. Construction is anticipated to begin in Spring 2026.

Electronics Recycling and Reuse Drop-off Event

Donate your electronics and clothing at tomorrow's Electronics Recycling and Reuse Drop-Off event in Millbrae! Accepted and non-accepted items are listed below. This event is free and open to all San Mateo County Residents.

Items accepted: small appliances (microwaves, hairdryers, vacuum cleaners, lamps (without bulbs), radios, phones, laptops, etc), other electronics (fax machines, copiers, printers, scanners, TVs, DVD players, electronic video games), clothing, shoes blankets, decorative pillows, and towels. We accept both working and nonworking electronics; working electronic items will be donated to local Goodwill stores for reuse.

Items NOT accepted: batteries of any kind, fluorescent lights, hazardous household waste, smoke detectors, solar panels, thermostats, large appliances (stoves, dryers, washing machines, air conditioners), furniture, bed sheets, bed pillows, or dirty clothes. Residents must provide proof of residency in San Mateo County (e.g., driver's license, utility bill, garbage collection bill, etc.).

Recycle your batteries properly ...or else!

Improperly disposed e-waste is dangerous. In the longterm, its toxic ingredients like lead, mercury, cadmium, and flame retardants, can leach into soil and groundwater. But there's an even more immediate danger, batteries thrown in the trash can cause fires.

Earlier this year in the East Bay, trashed batteries sparked a blaze inside a garbage truck. Thanks to quick action by the driver who dumped the burning trash onto a parking lot, further damage was prevented.

When batteries get crushed or damaged during garbage collection, they can ignite and combust, creating extremely dangerous situations for sanitation workers and potentially causing hundreds of thousands of dollars in damage. These fires happen across the country, and lithium ion batteries found in phones, laptops, power tools, and vapes are especially prone to catching fire when punctured or exposed to air.

There are two responsible ways for you to dispose of batteries in Millbrae. Our waste hauler, South San Francisco Scavenger, accepts batteries through your usual trash pickup. Just put the old batteries in a plastic bag and leave them on top of your garbage can. You can also drop off your small batteries at the collection box located in Millbrae City Hall anytime. Every battery properly recycled is one less hazardous item contaminating our soil and water.
