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**RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILLBRAE,  
CALIFORNIA ENACTING THE MILLBRAE 2016 WATER SHORTAGE  
CONTINGENCY PLAN, STAGE 1, AND IMPLEMENTING THE STATE WATER  
RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD'S DROUGHT RELATED  
EMERGENCY REGULATIONS**

**WHEREAS**, on January 17, 2014 Governor Edmund G. Brown Jr. issued Proclamation No. 1-17-2014 declaring a State of Emergency to exist in California due to severe drought conditions and calling on Californians to reduce their water usage by 20 percent; and

**WHEREAS**, on April 25, 2014, the Governor issued an Executive Order to strengthen the State's ability to manage water and directed the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) under its authority in California Water Code Section 1058.5 to adopt emergency regulations as it deems necessary to address water shortage conditions; and

**WHEREAS**, on July 15, 2014, the State Water Board adopted California Code of Regulations, Title 23, Sections 863, 864, and 865, emergency regulations (Emergency Regulations) finding a drought emergency in California and imposing water conservation measures on individuals and water suppliers; and

**WHEREAS**, the Emergency Regulations that applied primarily to outdoor water use went into effect on July 28, 2014, and were adopted by the City Council on September 9, 2014 and included enacting the Water Shortage Contingency Plan at Stage 1 in order to impose restrictions as required on the irrigation of ornamental landscapes and turf with potable water; and

**WHEREAS**, the Emergency Regulations were extended, amended and adopted by the State Water Board on March 17, 2015, which became effective March 27, 2015; and

**WHEREAS**, on April 1, 2015, Governor Brown issued Executive Order, B-29-15, which directed the State Water Board to impose restrictions on urban water suppliers to achieve a state-wide 25 percent reduction in potable urban usage in addition to other water conservation measures; and

**WHEREAS**, directive two of Executive Order, B-29-15 directed the State Water Board to consider the relative per capita usage of each urban water supplier's service area and require that areas with high per capita use achieve proportionally greater reductions than areas with low per capita use; and

**WHEREAS**, on May 5, 2015, the State Water Board adopted updated Drought Emergency Water Conservation Regulations which imposed a 16 percent water conservation standard on the City, and which were to remain in effect until approximately February 9, 2016,

**REGULARLY PASSED** and adopted this 26th day of July, 2016.
