



## MILLBRAE CITY COUNCIL MINUTES

December 11, 2018

### **CALL TO ORDER MILLBRAE CITY COUNCIL**

Mayor Papan called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m.

ROLL CALL: Mayor Gina Papan, Vice Mayor Wayne J. Lee, Councilmembers Ann Schneider, Anne Oliva, and Reuben D. Holober.

Jean Wong, Millbrae resident, asked the Council to nominate Councilmember Schneider as Mayor.

Nomination and Election of Mayor

Upon a motion/second by Oliva/Holober Wayne Lee was unanimously nominated for the Office of Mayor.

Administered by Mimi Lee, Nicholas Lee, Riley Labson, Leta Lee, and Michael Miller.

Newly Installed Mayor Declares the Nominations Open for the Office of Vice Mayor

Upon a motion/second by Oliva/Lee the nomination of Councilmember Reuben Holober as Vice Mayor failed with Councilmembers Oliva and Holober abstaining and Councilmember Schneider dissenting. Councilmember Papan and Mayor Lee did not cast their votes since the motion already failed.

Councilmember Schneider nominated herself. There was no second. The motion failed.

Councilmember Holober said that we could re-consider the prior motion to nominate him as Vice Mayor. He is willing to accept the nomination. He previously abstained because he was not campaigning for this.

Upon a motion/second by Oliva/Lee Reuben Holober was nominated for the Office of Vice Mayor with a vote of 4:1 with Councilmember Schneider dissenting.

Councilmember Schneider stated she had a desire to rescind her vote for Mayor Lee.

Oath of Office and Seating of Vice Mayor  
San Mateo County Community College Board President Richard Holober administered the Oath of Office.

**Comments from Newly Installed Councilmembers**

Councilmember Oliva said that she is very grateful for this job and very humbled. She will do the best job possible for the City.

Vice Mayor Holober thanked everyone for giving him the opportunity to serve and for placing their confidence in him and this Council. He looks forward to continuing to serve Millbrae.

Mayor Lee thanked everyone and extended his appreciation to the Council and staff. He thanked the residents for their support. He invited everyone to go to the reception at the Sixteen Mile House unless they want to stay for public comments.

At 8:11 pm the Council took a brief recess. The meeting re-convened at 8:24 pm for public communication.
